6. Handicap & Competitions Secretary's Report

AF Reported:

Whiteboard for teams, to date no responses except one occasion when the board has been used, The board may be able to be converted into a weekly schedule board to help advertise medals etc.

Medal weeks, the present weeklong events are more successful than the last two years, however there is no opportunity for entrants to be considered in the Titleist order of merit or the race to Woodhall Spa, both national competitions. This is because the medals are recorded manually and not on the club systems. To allow members to enter these, which is done automatically, the Sunday medal will now be a one-day event and the weeklong medal will be a 6-day event.

Handicaps, there is too much for AF to monitor and the Seniors section (Dave Eynon) needs to accept an increased workload for all Seniors.

Dilution of non-computer was felt to be possible after the AGM with the election of a new member. The structure of next year's committee will also allow GM to give more time to help these requirements as well as being able to spend more time on the secretarial duties. The captain will then only need to be the Chairmen

Withdrawal from competitions, is a problem and it needs addressing. In other than exceptional cases the competition entry fee should be paid, the present system of pay on the day precludes this, Could the proshop collect fees beforehand, preferably at the time of entry.

7. Treasurer's Report

DG reported:

The current finance is as shown in Appendix 1.

DG stated that he has £72 in the men's section accounts associated with the Men's Open Day. He asked what to do with it.

It was agreed that the entrance fee should be paid via BACS to the Men's Committee fund, and that no fees should be going through the Pro Shop.

8. Captain's Report

GM reported:

Access to the main committee minutes seems to be limited for our members. Could a folder be created and stored with the competitions folders in the foyer?

Previously GM suggested in the May meeting utilising the purchased artificial grass on the main tees during winter months, moving regularly enabling the full course to be used and cards put it. Yeovil Golf Club use this method successfully. Further discussions were had how this approach could be adopted, perhaps a trial period.

In today's meeting AE advised he had discussions with Yeovil. AE expressed it could be done on the par 4's and 5's but needs a lot of thought, as the winter tees are in places which avoid the wet areas. AE is not dismissing the idea and a suggestion was made to contact a few members with experience in carpet laying to aid in coming to a solution.

There were tree stumps and found stone to bury, and shots to be played from that area.

Renovations will start in October, causing minimal disruption where possible to golf, weather conditions permitting.

The Subaru stableford is on Saturday open to ladies and gents. Agreat prize table plus vouchers and 2 spot all included.

TaylorMade Demo Day on 6th September, Abbey Hill Day, Freeman Trophy, Rotary Day and Air Ambulance Day plus many more to come. Teams doing great.
