1. Introduction

JSB welcomed everyone to the April 2016 meeting.

An apology was received from Les Wills and Andrew England

2. Minutes of the Last Meeting 24th March 2016

The Minutes of the last Meeting were agreed, proposed by MS and seconded by PF

3. Matters Arising from Meeting 24th March 2016

Matters arising were addressed either at appropriate Agenda Items or as follows:

Archiving – Update

PD stated that the sub committee consisting of JB, DG and PD had met and started work; it had been decide to share the work between the three of them with each being given sections to prepare.

He went on to say that it is a large task and will take some time to complete. Action – On Going JB, PD and DG

Club Rules

Point 1.10f the proposed club rules needs further definition.

Action: - PD in-conjunction with JSB to expand point 1.1 on going

Club Handbook – Update

PD stated the handbook was now complete and the changes suggested had been incorporated. It was agreed that the handbook should be forwarded to Andrew England for incorporation into the Wheathill web site and to all officers of the club. **Action: PD**

Shoe Cleaner

DG asked if we could have a pit with grating over it next to the shoe cleaner to catch debris produced by wheel and shoe cleaning.

4. **CONGU – Club handicap**

The senior's section is considering a trial run using the Codgers Cup competition. Action: DE On Going

DE stated that in discussion with other clubs they allow members to have two handicaps, one for competitions and one for general play.

It was unanimously agreed that CONGU clearly states only one handicap is allowed, no further discussion ensued. **Closed**

5. Slow play

MS reported:

It was reported to me that a member was marking his card on every green with a queue of players behind. I am afraid that the person who reported the situation would not give the offending members name.

I also followed a four ball on two buggies they were like a rash they certainly would not need the aid of Andrew's new course guide as they saw the biggest part of it on their way round. This also included the group in front of them as their golf was to a similar standard with no one in front of them.

We need to implement the Marshalls as soon as possible as the course is getting a lot more congested.

I suggest that the courses Marshalls are used on regular basis when available not just for competitions but also during general play.

MS has a list of volunteers, and is to discuss with Andrew England on the use of Buggies, a rota and the possibility of providing snacks for the volunteers

A Course Marshall Sign is to be produced for attaching to the buggy when needed. Action: MS to coordinate with AE.

It was stated that the course clocks are not working and need to be fixed **Action: MS**

6. Competition Entrance Fee

AE requested that the issue of match fees which have been static for many years be increased, guide line being $\pounds 12$ for home players and $\pounds 15$ for away players.

This would apply to 3 Counties League, Avalon League and all Senior Matches.

The Ladies section has a different match fee structure.

7. Qualifying History

A change made to Club V1 has altered the way in which a players playing history can be obtained.

I have also received from England Golf a reminder of the Gold Medal competitions for this year the South West venue is Burnham & Berrow, the cost being £25/person. The competition has 120 places available in each venue and club medal winners for 2015 can apply. Places are allocated to the players with the best nett differentials of their qualifying scores. The best 14 scores form each venue go forward to the grand final

BBC Somerset's reporter Jack Murley is coming to the event on Wednesday the 11th May to interview Andrew, the BHF representative and Myself and this will be live on air with Ben McGrail.

I have had some issues with the etiquette in the clubhouse with members ignoring the signs and still wearing hats and golf shoes in the clubhouse and in some cases a very unpleasant response when asked to abide to the rules.

On a lighter note after the majority of players on Sunday had the most horrendous rounds. I asked Andrew if he had something done to the course. Andrew's response was we all need lessons.

14. Management Report

AE reported:

The course is hanging in there well considering the awful weather. The greens are improving week on week and will be vertidrained and top-dressed in the coming days. The scars of the fuserium disease suffered in the autumn will finally grow through and we are optimistic of producing good surfaces for the summer.

Fairways have been fertilised now the temperature has increased and this will give them a much-needed boost. On this note, last week at Wincanton the green keeper called for a posy of members to help with a morning of divoting (picture included). We walked the fairways with a bucket and trowel accompanied with a truck of sand and seed for quick refills, along with pitchforks. Would the committee like to gather the troops for an attack on our course soon? Bacon Roll and coffee to follow at lunch time courtesy of the Management! List on the board? Clear date early start!

We continue to have teething problems with the touch screen in the corridor upgrade. Hopefully to be sorted ASAP!

The issue of qualifiers has raised its head yet again. The management urge all sections to rethink and fall in line with CONGU's recommendations of 3 qualifiers. We are the only club in Somerset requiring 5 qualifiers and England Golf and Somerset Golf Union advise us to do the same as everyone else. A top player could qualify to play in County Championships and not in one of our own competitions! It's time for a fresh start next season. (Email included from county attached as (Attachment 2)

The Professional shop is developing an Astroturf launch monitor area to the side of the putting green. This will enable us to test equipment, swings, distances and flight to improve all aspects of people's long game. We shall be advertising special days for game improvements, watch this space!

We hope you like the new sign on the front of the golf club which we think looks much better and would also like to thank all those who have been planting trees and painting benches to get us ready for a good season.

Team matches must speed up and stay close together. Players are losing numerous holes on matches in front causing delay to the match, other players on the course and food service in the clubhouse. Team captains are urged to help keep play moving.

Wheathill hosted the Somerset under 14s championships. A very cold and windy day, needless to say the players didn't feel cold. The ladies section provided drinks and biscuits for the boys. The ladies section had their first inter league match of the season at home against Wells. Wheathill won the rubber 4 games to 3.

The Pro-captain's competitions start this month, good luck to all who are entered. The Margarita went of very well, always a popular competition with the ladies. The winning pair was Lesley Wills and Denise Malling with 36 points. Well done to them both.

19. Seniors' Section Report

DE reported:

JB reported:

Good to report this month that the Junior Qualifiers are back on, Oliver England played his first qualifying card in the medal this weekend and Callum's Net 63 lost him another shot off his H/c – Well done Boys!

Both are taking part in the Judith Rowsell Alliance on Bank Holiday Monday.

In the Somerset U14 champs held at Wheathill on Thursday 7th April, Tomas Wray shot 99 - Net 65 to come overall 6/33 and Callum shot 87 / 67 Nett which put him 9th.

We currently have 11 junior members, only a couple now without H/c.

Jill and I have been helped by Nicki England (who is tremendously supportive of the section) in securing an afternoon in May to attend Butleigh School with the Xtreme Golf. We are also attending Castle Cary School in the same week then Keinton on 14th June.

Good Morning,

Over the last few week we have received a number of questions regarding supplementary scores for category 1 golfers, preferred lies and Bunkers marked as GUR.

I though a quick email to all Counties and handicap advisors may help.

Supplementary Scores for Category 1 Golfers:

If a player in this category holds a 'competition' handicap they are unable to return any supplementary score until 1st September and then only if they have not returned enough scores to maintain their competition handicap beyond the 1st Jan. (as in the CONGU book Clause 21)

If a player in this category has lost his 'competition' status they are entitled to return 3 supplementary scores to regain the 'competition' status. Please note this is a digression for England Golf and has been missed out the CONGU book but is included in the software specification.

Preferred Lies:

As CONGU have now asked each Home Union to define the period for the use of preferred lies, England Golf have decide to keep this as 1st October to 30th April. Clearly with the current weather conditions this may not be long enough, so I am going to extend this for 2016 till 31st May should clubs need to extend beyond this you can give extensions within your county.

The following local rule wording must be used:

'A ball lying on a closely mown area through the green may be lifted without penalty and cleaned. Before lifting the ball, the player must mark its position. Having lifted the ball, he must place it on a spot within 6 inches [150mm] of and not nearer the hole than where it

originally lay, that is not in a hazard and not on a putting green.

A player may place his ball only once, and it is in play when it has been placed (Rule 20-4). If the ball fails to come to rest on the spot on which it is placed, Rule 20-3d applies. If the ball when placed comes to rest on the spot on which it is placed and it subsequently moves, there is no penalty and the ball must be played as it lies, unless the provisions of any other Rule apply. If the player fails to mark the position of the ball before lifting it or moves the ball in any other manner, such as rolling it with a club, he incurs a penalty of one stroke.

Note. 'Closely Mown Area" means any area of the course, including paths through the rough, cut to fairway height or less.

Penalty for breach of Local Rule: Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – Two strokes If a player incurs the general penalty for a breach of this Local Rule, no additional penalty under the Local Rule is applied'

Note: Competition Play Conditions will only apply when the specified area is within six inches (150 mm). See Clause 15.3

Bunkers marked as GUR.

This has caused some debate within CONGU as to the impact of Bunkers can have on a competition retaining it qualifying status.

CONGU state that when 'some bunkers' are out of play due to maintenance, and are marked as GUR an qualifying competition can be played.

What counts as some?

CONGU have struggled to define this, so <u>England Golf advise that if more than 50% of bunkers are out</u> of play due to maintenance or weather conditions then the competition must be declared as a nongualifier.

CONGU had previously suggested that all bunkers could be out of play but this is likely to have an effect on the SSS/CSS and this also goes against a ruling from the R&A re flooded bunkers (See below)

Local Rule Providing Relief Without Penalty from Bunker Filled with Casual Water

Question:

May a Committee make a Local Rule allowing a player to drop out of any bunker filled with casual water, without penalty, contrary to Rule 25-1b(ii)?

Answer:

No. The Committee may not make a Local Rule providing generally that flooded bunkers are ground under repair through the green, as such a Local Rule waives a penalty imposed by the Rules of Golf, contrary to Rule 33-8b.

However, in exceptional circumstances, where certain specific bunkers are completely flooded and there is no reasonable likelihood of the bunkers drying up during the round, the Committee may introduce a Local Rule providing relief without penalty from specific bunkers. Prior to introducing such a Local Rule, the Committee must be convinced that such exceptional circumstances exist and that providing relief without penalty from specific bunkers is more appropriate than simply applying Rule 25-1b(ii). If the Committee elects to introduce a Local Rule, the following wording is suggested.

"The flooded bunker on [insert location of bunker; e.g. left of 5th green]is ground under repair If a player's ball lies in that bunker or if that bunker interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing and the player wishes to take relief, he must take relief outside the bunker, without penalty, in accordance with Rule 25-1b(i). All other bunkers on the course, regardless of whether they contain water, maintain their status as hazards and the Rules apply accordingly."

In a competition played over more than one round, such a Local Rule maybe introduced or rescinded between rounds.

Hopefully this will answer some of these questions and ensure that we are all giving the same information to players and clubs.
